Ph.D. in Curriculum and Instruction

Mercer's Ph.D. in Curriculum and Instruction prepares educators to become influential leaders and researchers. as well as advance the quality of education at the local, state, and national level. The program focuses on societal changes that are placing an increasing emphasis on the role of the professional educator.

Upon completion of the program and a passing score on the Georgia Assessments for the Certification of Educators (GACE) Content Assessment for Curriculum and Instruction, eligible candidates will be recommended for a Level 7 certificate in Curriculum and Instruction. This program does not lead to initial certification.

Why Mercer's Ph.D. Programs in P-12 Education?

Mercer University's College of Education has been teaching Georgia's teachers and educational leaders for over 100 years and is widely acknowledged for its highly individualized, student-centered approach to education. Earning a Ph.D. in Mercer's P-12 education programs equips educators and leaders with the skills and expertise to thrive in a variety of educational settings. Small classes, accomplished faculty, and hands-on field experiences in classroom settings make these programs distinctive, and program candidates are able to earn their degree while working full time.

Program Structure

Mercer's Ph.D. programs in P-12 Education are offered in a combination of online and weekend courses on Mercer's Atlanta campus, and require a minimum of 63 graduate semester hours of study beyond the master's degree, including research and dissertation requirements. Online classes are delivered weekly via the University's learning management system. Oncampus classes include doctoral seminars that occur three Saturdays per semester from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. with a midday break.

Classes are taken sequentially over 11 semesters in 16-week courses during fall and spring and in eightweek courses during the summer. The dissertation process is supported throughout the program, and the cohort model allows for collaboration with classmates and faculty mentors.

Admission Requirements

Applicants seeking admission must hold a master's degree from a regionally accredited institution with a minimum graduate cumulative GPA of 3.5.

Both programs admit students once per year in May.

Required Application Materials Include:

- · Completed application for admission
- \$35 non-refundable application fee
- Official undergraduate and graduate transcripts from each college/university attended
- Recent GRE scores (within the last five years).
 The target scores are 151 verbal (51st percentile), 151 quantitative (43rd percentile), and 4.0 (59th percentile) for analytical writing.*
- · Current vita or résumé
- Three professional letters of recommendation
- Written narrative of career and academic goals
- Interview with program faculty
- **Curriculum and Instruction applicants:** three years of teaching experience preferred if the applicant is a professional educator
- P-12 School Leadership applicants: copy of current Educational Leadership certification from the Georgia Professional Standards Commission (GaPSC), if applicable

*GRE scores are not the sole criterion; applicants with scores close to the target are encouraged to apply and will need to provide stronger evidence of the ability to complete doctoral-level work and independent research.

International applicants should consult the University catalog for additional requirements.
