Master Of Education (M.Ed.) - Tier One

Mercer's Tier One, M.Ed. in Educational Leadership is designed to prepare candidates for leadership positions up to the assistant principal within the school, or a variety of district-level leadership positions that do not supervise principals.

The 30 credit-hour program includes relevant clinical practice, which provides opportunities for candidates to apply knowledge and skills learned in the program in a hands-on manner. Upon completion of the program and passing scores on the Georgia Assessments for the Certification of Educators (GACE) Educational Leadership content assessment, candidates will be eligible for Level 5 Educational Leadership certification. Any certified educator with three years of experience is eligible for this program.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Prepare to serve as a building-level or systemlevel educational leader in Georgia's schools
- Develop a great depth of knowledge of leadership theory
- Gain hands-on, in-school experience to put required knowledge into practice

Specialist In Education (Ed.S.) - Tier Two

Mercer's Tier Two, Ed.S. in Educational Leadership supports current educational leaders in the development of leadership theory and practical skills as they look to advance to the top levels of educational leadership. Diverse field experiences throughout the program help prepare leaders to support the needs of their educators, staff, students, and community. Mercer's faculty provide continual support to students, assisting in their development as transformational leaders.

The 33 credit-hour program can be completed in two years. Upon completion of the program, students will be eligible to upgrade their leadership certificate to Level 6. Leaders with this certification are eligible for all leadership positions at the building and district levels.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- · Strengthen core knowledge of leadership theory
- Combine weekly learning objectives with onthe-job experiences to apply new classroom knowledge
- Prepare educators to manage and lead schools and school districts

Non-Degree Certification-Only Programs

Both the Tier One and Tier Two degree programs are also offered as non-degree, certification-only programs for eligible applicants. These students must meet the admission requirements as degree-seeking students and will take many of the same courses. The number of courses needed for the certification-only option depends upon a transcript review, which can be completed prior to the application process. Applicants must hold a master's degree or higher for Tier One certification only. For Tier Two certification, applicants must hold a specialist's degree or higher.

Program Delivery

Both the Tier One and Tier Two (full degree and certification-only) programs are delivered in the same format. The programs feature a 50/50 hybrid model, with each individual class lasting eight weeks and meeting once per week. In this model, half of the class meetings for each course occur in the evenings at Mercer, and half of the class meetings are devoted to clinical practice hours at the candidate's own school.



Tift College of Education Leadership Academy

Every year for one Saturday in March, students come together on the Atlanta campus to network and learn from experts in educational leadership. Tift College of Education's Leadership Academy includes breakout sessions, designed to expose candidates to diverse ideas and methods, covering topics that complement and enhance the learning experience.



Programs accept students three times per year in August, January, and May at Mercer's locations in Atlanta, Henry County, and Macon.
