

GENERATE Grant Program - Pathway to Teaching

INITIAL TEACHER CERTIFICATION PROGRAM



Mercer University's **Georgia Educators Networking to Revolutionize and Transform Education (GENERATE)** teacher residency program provides a path for teachers without certification or career changers to obtain either **Bachelor of Science in Education (B.S.Ed.)** or **Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.)** degrees, become certified teachers in Georgia, and teach in high-need content areas within partnering school districts. The program provides individuals with a combination of professional development, mentoring, professional learning communities, and an embedded endorsement.

Program Commitment

As a condition of the grant program, candidates must commit to serving at a school within a partnering school district for three years after degree completion. Upon admission to the program, candidates sign a Scholarship Service Agreement affirming their willingness to serve within the district in which their student teaching is completed. If candidates are unable to meet this requirement, the grant will be converted to a low-interest loan and is subject to the repayment schedule outlined in the agreement.

PROGRAM BENEFITS

- Tuition and fees paid by grant program
- \$500 stipend for books and materials per semester
- Annual summit to reunite with cohort and discuss achievements
- Participants will earn an endorsement through the program

Admission Requirements	Applicants seeking undergraduate admission must have a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.5 (on a 4.0 scale), must be in good standing at the college or university most recently attended, and must have either an associate degree or a minimum 60 semester hours of relevant coursework in general and pre-education foundational courses. Required application components include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> · Completed application for admission · Application fee - WAIVED · Official transcripts from all previously attended institutions · High school or GED transcript (if applicable) · Bright from the Start background check from the Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning (DECAL) · For full admission to Teacher Candidacy and program entry, all applicants must pass the Georgia Educator Ethics assessment. <i>International applicants should consult the University catalog for additional requirements</i>	Applicants seeking admission must hold a bachelor's degree from a college or university accredited by an institutional accreditor recognized by the U.S. Department of Education with a minimum undergraduate cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale. Required application components include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> · Completed application for admission · Application fee - WAIVED · Official transcripts from all previously attended institutions · GACE Georgia Educator Ethics Assessment completion certificate · Passing score on the GACE Content Assessment in the desired field of certification · Successful completion of a specified number of semester hours of content area coursework earned in conjunction with a bachelor's degree or higher from a GaPSC-approved institution. Number of hours depends on transcript analysis. <i>International applicants should consult the University catalog for additional requirements</i>
