## INITIAL TEACHER CERTIFICATION PROGRAM



Mercer University's **Bachelor of Science in Education (B.S.Ed.)** programs prepare paraprofessionals, waiver teachers, and aspiring educators to become certified teachers in the State of Georgia. Successful program completion and passing scores on the appropriate Georgia Assessments for the Certification of Educators® (GACE®) Content Assessments, as approved by the Georgia Professional Standards Commission (GaPSC), lead to eligibility for Level 4 initial teacher certification.

### Choose from four areas of study:

#### EARLY LEARNING AND DEVELOPMENT: BIRTH-K

The Early Learning and Development major prepares you to promote the success, development, and inclusion of all young learners in preschools, early learning centers, childcare centers, or early childcare agencies. An embedded Special Education Preschool (Ages 3–5) endorsement is included.

A non-certification track of the Early Learning and Development program is also offered.

#### ELEMENTARY/SPECIAL EDUCATION: GRADES P-5

The Elementary/Special Education major prepares you to understand young children from a holistic perspective and equips you to construct a classroom curriculum appropriate for a child's cognitive, emotional, social, and physical development.

#### SECONDARY EDUCATION: GRADES 6-12

The Secondary Education major prepares you to effectively facilitate learning for a group of unique and diverse individuals transitioning to adolescence and adulthood. Choose a concentration in English, History, Mathematics, or Political Science.

#### COMPUTER SCIENCE EDUCATION: GRADES P-12

The Computer Science Education major prepares you to bridge the gap between technology and learning, equipping students with the knowledge and skills necessary for the digital age.

### ADDITIONAL OPTIONS FOR INITIAL TEACHER CERTIFICATION

Students who already hold a bachelor's degree in a field other than education may wish to consider Mercer's Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.) that leads to initial teacher certification. This option is beneficial for both recent college graduates and career changers. ## Admission Requirements

Applicants seeking undergraduate admission must have a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale and must be in good standing at the college or university most recently attended. Applicants may be eligible to transfer credits toward the degree. Learn more and apply at [workingadults.mercer.edu](http://workingadults.mercer.edu).

### REQUIRED APPLICATION MATERIALS INCLUDE:

- Completed application for admission
- \$25 non-refundable application fee (\$50 for international students)
- Official transcripts from all previously attended institutions
- High school or GED transcript (if applicable)

Note: After being granted admission to the University, students must pass the Georgia Educator Ethics assessment, maintain a 2.5 GPA, complete general education requirements in math and writing, and complete an application for teacher candidacy to enroll in upper-level, restricted courses.

### BENEFIT FROM A TUITION GRANT
