Continue Working

Mercer's B.S.Ed. and M.A.T. programs are designed with working adults in mind, so students complete the programs through a blended combination of online instruction and in-person, school-based field experiences. With our programs' flexibility, many of our students are able to continue working while earning their degrees.

Transfer Your Credits

We want you to get the credit you deserve toward completion of your Mercer degree. That's why we've made the process of transferring credits as seamless as possible. Transfer courses are evaluated on a case-by-case basis, and each student receives a personalized program plan after transfer credits are reviewed.

Benefit from a Tuition Grant

Receive Credit for Professional Experience

Students with prior professional experience in the field of education may be eligible to receive course credit by prior learning assessment.
